

INTREPRETER: Pursuant to section 11435.20 of the Government Code, the hearing shall be conducted in English language. If a party or party's witness does not proficiently speak or understand the English language and before commencement of the hearing requests language assistance, an agency subject to the language assistance requirement in section 11435.15 of the Government Code shall provide a certified interpreter or an interpreter approved by the administrative law judge conducting the proceedings. The cost of providing the interpreter shall be paid by the agency having jurisdiction over the matter if the administrative law judge or hearing officer so directs, otherwise by the party for whom the interpreter is provided. If you or a witness requires the assistance of an interpreter, ample advance notice of this fact should be given to the Office of Administrative Hearings so that appropriate arrangements can be made.

CONTINUANCES: Under section 11524 of the Government Code, the agency may grant a continuance, but when an administrative law judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings has been assigned to the hearing, no continuance may be granted except by him or her or by the presiding judge for good cause. **STIPULATED SURRENDER OF
LICENSE AND ORDER**

20 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
21 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

22 **PARTIES**

23 1. Jessica Sieferman (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Veterinary Medical
24 Board (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this
25 matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by James M. Ledakis,
26 Supervising Deputy Attorney General.

27 2. Teresa Nalini McCaffray (Respondent) is representing herself in this proceeding and
28 has chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.

1 surrenders her Registered Veterinarian Technician License No. RVT 12323 for the Board's
2 formal acceptance.

3 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue
4 an order accepting the surrender of her Registered Veterinarian Technician License without
5 further process.

6 **RESERVATION**

7 10. The admissions made by Respondent herein are only for the purposes of this
8 proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Veterinary Medical Board or other
9 professional licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or
10 civil proceeding.

11 **CONTINGENCY**

12 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands
13 and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly
14 with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by
15 Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not
16 withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers
17 and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the
18 Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this
19 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not
20 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

21 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
22 copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures
23 thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

24 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
25 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
26 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
27 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
28

1 may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
2 executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

3 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
4 the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

5 **ORDER**

6 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Registered Veterinarian Technician License No. RVT
7 12323, issued to Respondent Teresa Nalini McCaffray, is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

8 1. The surrender of Respondent's Registered Veterinarian Technician License and the
9 acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline
10 against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part
11 of Respondent's license history with the Board.

12 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Registered Veterinarian
13 Technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

14 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board her pocket license and, if one was
15 issued, her wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

16 4. If she ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of
17 California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with
18 all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or
19 petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Petition to Revoke Probation
20 No. 4602019000094 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the
21 Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.

22 5. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
23 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
24 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Petition to Revoke Probation, No.
25 4602019000094 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose
26 of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.





20 Complainant alleges:

21 **PARTIES**

22 1. Jessica Sieferman (Complainant) brings this Petition to Revoke Probation solely in
23 her official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Veterinary Medical Board (Board),
24 Department of Consumer Affairs.

25 2. On or about August 30, 2017, the Board issued Registered Veterinarian Technician
26 Registration Number RVT 12323 to Teresa Nalini McCaffray (Respondent). The Registered
27 Veterinarian Technician Registration was in effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
28 herein and will expire on January 31, 2019, unless renewed.

1 request additional in-person reports of the probationary terms and conditions. If the
2 final written quarterly report is not made as directed, the period of probation shall be
3 extended until such time as the final report is received by the Board. You shall make
available all patient records, hospital records, books, logs, and other documents to the
Board, upon request.

4 8. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because she failed to comply with
5 Probation Condition 3, referenced above, in that Respondent did not submit timely quarterly
6 written reports for the following periods: October 2017 (3rd Quarter) – submitted 6 days late;
7 January 2018 (4th Quarter) – submitted over four months late; April 2018 (1st Quarter) –
8 submitted 42 days late; and July 2018 (2nd Quarter) – never submitted. Respondent was warned
9 that failure to submit reports on time is a violation of her probation. Furthermore, the quarterly
10 reports were not in compliance due to the false statement under the penalty of perjury that
11 Respondent has complied with every term and condition of her probation.

12 **SECOND CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION**

13 **(Cooperation with Probation Surveillance)**

14 9. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 4 stated:

15 You shall comply with the Board's probation surveillance program. All costs for
16 probation monitoring shall be borne by you. Probation monitoring costs are set at a rate
of \$100 per month for the duration of probation. You shall notify the Board of any
17 change of name or address of record within thirty (30) days of the change. You shall
notify the Board immediately in writing if you leave California to reside or practice in
18 another state. You shall notify the Board immediately upon return to California.

19 10. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because she failed to comply with
20 Probation Condition 4, referenced above, in that she has not made any of her scheduled payments
21 towards probation monitoring costs.

22 **THIRD CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION**

23 **(Submit to Drug Testing)**

24 11. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 16 stated:

25 You shall immediately submit to drug testing, at your cost, upon request by the
26 Board or its designee. There will be no confidentiality in test results; positive test results
will be immediately reported to the Board and to your current employer.

27 Drug testing will be mandatory for a minimum of six (6) months. After six (6)
28 months, the Board, at its discretion, may suspend or reduce the frequency of drug

1 testing if you have submitted to all required drug tests and all tests have been negative
2 for prohibited substances.

3 12. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because she failed to comply with
4 Probation Condition 16, referenced above. Respondent is required to call-in or log-in to
5 FirstSource Solutions, the Board's designated testing provider, on a daily basis. Between
6 September of 2017 and November of 2018, Respondent failed to check-in with FirstSource
7 Solutions on seventy-two (76) separate occasions. Furthermore, Respondent was selected for
8 testing, but failed to provide a sample on the following seven dates: October 12, 2017; October
9 22, 2017; December 2, 2017; January 17, 2018; February 12, 2018; March 3, 2018; and April 20,
10 2018.

11 **FOURTH CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION**

12 **(Abstention from Alcohol Use)**

13 13. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 18 stated:

14 You shall abstain completely from the use of alcoholic beverages.

15 14. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because she failed to comply with
16 Probation Condition 18, referenced above. The circumstances are as follows:

17 a. On May 17, 2018, a blood specimen provided by Respondent subsequently
18 tested positive for Phosphatidyl Ethanol (PEth)¹ (847 ng/mL). On June 4, 2018, the Board
19 received confirmation from the Medical Review Officer for FirstSource Solutions that the PEth
20 result level was consistent with significant alcohol ingestion in the 2-4 weeks prior to the test.

21 b. A Violation Letter dated May 30, 2018, was sent to Respondent informing her
22 of the violation, and reminding her that she must abstain completely from the use of alcoholic
23 beverages.

24 ///

25 ¹ The formation of PEth [phosphatidyl ethanol] is specifically dependent on ethanol. The
26 diagnostic specificity of PEth as an alcohol biomarker is theoretically 100%. The half-life of PEth
27 in blood is approximately 4 days. The amount of alcohol consumed correlates to blood
28 concentration of PEth and PEth has been shown to be a more sensitive indicator of alcohol
consumption than traditional alcohol markers. (Isaksson, et al. *Phosphatidylethanol in blood (B-
PEth): a marker for alcohol use and abuse*. Drug Test Anal. 2011 Apr; 3(4):195-200. doi:
10.1002/dta.278. Epub 2011 Mar 25.)

1. Revoking the probation that was granted by the Veterinary Medical Board in Case No. 4602017000504 thereby revoking Registered Veterinarian Technician Registration Number RVT 12323 issued to Respondent Teresa Nalini McCaffray;
2. Revoking or suspending Registered Veterinarian Technician Registration Number RVT 12323, issued to Respondent Teresa Nalini McCaffray;
3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.

1) TERESA MCCAFFRAY, applicant for a Registered Veterinary Technician registration (hereinafter "applicant"), and, Annemarie Del Mugnaio, Executive Officer of the Veterinary Medical Board of California, hereby stipulate as follows:

2) On November 16, 2016, applicant submitted a Registered Veterinary Technician Initial Exam application for a Registered Veterinary Technician Registration in the State of California. Applicant disclosed a May 10, 2005 conviction for driving under the influence of alcohol above the legal limit, causing bodily injury, in violation of section 23153(b) of the California Vehicle Code, on the Registered Veterinary Technician application.

3) Section 480 (a) of the Business and Professions Code states that a board may deny a license on the grounds that the applicant has one or more of the following: Section 480 (a)(1) Been convicted of a crime; and Section 480 (a)(3)(A) Done any act that if done that if done by a licentiate of the business or profession in question, would be grounds for suspension or revocation of license. Section 4883 of the Business and Professions Code states that the Board may take action for criminal convictions including, but not limited to the following: Section 4883 (g)(2)(B) The use of any of the dangerous drugs specified in Section 4022, or of alcoholic beverages to the extent, or in any manner as to be dangerous or injurious to a person licensed or registered under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person so licensed or registered to conduct with safety the practice authorized by the license or registration.

The above support a conclusion that grounds exist for denial pursuant to Sections 480(a)(1), 480 (a)(3)(A), 4883, and 4883(g)(2)(B) of the Business and Professions Code.

4) Under Section 4842 of the Business and Professions Code, the Veterinary Medical Board of California (Board) may deny a registration to an applicant because of criminal convictions.

Alternatively, the Board has the discretionary authority to issue a probationary registration with terms and conditions, pursuant to Section 4845 of the Business and Professions Code.

5) Applicant acknowledges that he/she has a right to request a Statement of Issues and a hearing upon denial of registration for cause. Applicant waives notice of hearing and judicial review in favor of this Stipulation for a Probationary Registration, which is subject to approval by the Board. If not approved, this Stipulation is null and void and may not be used for any purpose.

6) This Stipulation for a Probationary Registration shall be subject to approval by the Veterinary Medical Board of California. Applicant understands and agrees that counsel for the staff of the Veterinary Medical Board of California may communicate directly with the Board regarding this proposed Stipulation, without notice to or participation by applicant or his/her counsel. By signing the Stipulation, applicant understands and agrees that he/she may not withdraw this agreement or seek to rescind the Stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this Stipulation, the offer of a Stipulation for a Probationary Registration shall be of no force or effect; except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

The staff recommends to the Board that a Probationary Registration be issued as follows:

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that upon completion of all requirements for licensure, a Registered Veterinary Technician Registration shall be issued to Teresa McCaffray, applicant, on a probationary basis. Failure to successfully complete all statutory and regulatory requirements for licensure within two (2) years from the effective date shall void this decision and it will have no effect. Upon issuance of a Registered Veterinary Technician Registration, on a probationary basis, said registration will be subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. TWO year probation

You shall be placed on probation for a period of two years to begin after satisfactory completion of all statutory and regulatory requirements for registration, including but not limited to taking and passing all required Veterinary Technician examinations.

2. OBEY ALL LAWS

You shall obey all federal and state laws and regulations substantially related to the

practice of veterinary medicine. Further, within 30 days of any arrest or conviction, you shall report to the Board and provide proof of compliance with the terms and conditions of the court order including, but not limited to, probation and restitution requirements.

3. QUARTERLY REPORTS AND INTERVIEWS

You shall report quarterly to the Board or its designee, under penalty of perjury, on forms provided by the Board, stating whether there has been compliance with all terms and conditions of probation. In addition, the Board, at its discretion, may request additional in-person reports of the probationary terms and conditions. If the final written quarterly report is not made as directed, the period of probation shall be extended until such time as the final report is received by the Board. You shall make available all patient records, hospital records, books, logs, and other documents to the Board, upon request.

4. COOPERATION WITH PROBATION SURVEILLANCE

You shall comply with the Board's probation surveillance program. All costs for probation monitoring shall be borne by you. Probation monitoring costs are set at a rate of \$100 per month for the duration of probation. You shall notify the Board of any change of name or address of record within thirty (30) days of the change. You shall notify the Board immediately in writing if you leave California to reside or practice in another state. You shall notify the Board immediately upon return to California.

5. NO PRECEPTORSHIPS OR SUPERVISION OF INTERNS

You shall not supervise a registered intern and shall not perform any of the duties of a preceptor.

6. NOTICE TO EMPLOYERS

You shall notify all present and prospective employers of the decision in this case and the terms, conditions, and restrictions imposed on you by the decision in this case. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this decision and within fifteen (15) days of you undertaking new employment, you shall cause your employer to report to the Board in writing, acknowledging the employer has read the decision in this case and understands your terms and conditions of probation.

7. NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES

You shall, upon or before the effective date of this decision, post or circulate a notice which actually recites the offenses for which you have been disciplined and the terms and conditions of probation, to all registered veterinary employees, and to any preceptor, intern or extern involved in your veterinary practice. With fifteen (15) days of the effective date of the decision, you shall cause your employees to report to the Board in writing, acknowledging the employees have read the decision in the case and understand your terms and conditions of probation.

8. OWNERS AND OFFICERS (CORPORATIONS OR PARTNERSHIPS): KNOWLEDGE OF THE LAW

You shall provide, within thirty (30) days after the effective date of the decision, signed and dated statements from the owners, officers, or any owner or holder of ten percent (10%) or more of the interest in you or your stock, stating said individuals have read and are familiar with federal and state laws and regulations governing the practice of veterinary medicine.

9. TOLLING OF PROBATION

If you reside out of state upon or after effective date of the decision, you must comply with the following conditions only: quarterly reports and interviews, tolling of probation, continuing education and cost recovery. If you return to California, you must comply or be subject to all probationary conditions for the period of probation.

During probation, you shall engage in the practice of veterinary medicine in California for a minimum of 24 hours per week for six (6) consecutive months or as determined by the Board. Should you fail to engage in the practice of veterinary medicine in California as set forth above, the time outside of the practice shall not apply to reduction of the probationary terms.

10. VIOLATION OF PROBATION

If you violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving you notice and the opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation and carry out the disciplinary order that was stayed. If an accusation or petition to revoke probation is filed against you during probation, or if the Attorney General's Office has been requested to prepare any disciplinary action against your license, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.

11. COMPLETION OF PROBATION

All costs for probation monitoring and/or mandatory premises inspections shall be borne by you. Failure to pay all costs due shall result in an extension of probation until the matter is resolved and costs paid. Upon successful completion of probation and all payment of all fees due, your license will be fully restored.

12. LIMITATION ON PRACTICE

During probation, you are prohibited from practicing veterinary medicine from a location or mobile veterinary practice which does not have a current premises permit issued by the Board.

13. SUPERVISED PRACTICE

You shall practice only under the supervision of a veterinarian. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the decision, you shall have your supervisor submit a report to the

Board in writing stating the supervisor has read the decision in case number 4602017000504. Should you change employment, you shall have your new supervisor, within fifteen (15) days after employment commences, submit a report to the Board in writing stating the supervisor has read the decision in case number 4602017000504.

Your supervisor shall file monthly reports with the Board. These reports shall be in a form designated by the Board and shall include a narrative section where the supervisor provides his or her conclusions and opinions concerning the issues described above and the basis for his or her conclusions and opinions. If the supervisor terminates or is otherwise no longer available, you shall not practice until a new supervisor has been appointed by the Board.

14. NO OWNERSHIP

You shall not have any legal or beneficial interest in any business, firm, partnership, or corporation currently or hereinafter licensed or registered by the Board and shall not own any veterinary hospital.

15. NO MANAGEMENT OR ADMINISTRATION

You shall not manage or be the administrator of any veterinary hospital.

16. SUBMIT TO DRUG TESTING

You shall immediately submit to drug testing, at your cost, upon request by the Board or its designee. There will be no confidentiality in test results; positive test results will be immediately reported to the Board and to your current employer.

Drug testing will be mandatory for a minimum of six (6) months. After six (6) months, the Board, at its discretion, may suspend or reduce the frequency of drug testing if you have submitted to all required drug tests and all tests have been negative for prohibited substances.

17. ABSTAIN FROM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

You shall completely abstain from the personal use or possession of controlled substances, as defined in the California Uniform Controlled Substances Act, and dangerous drugs as defined in Section 4211 of the Business and Professions Code, except when lawfully prescribed by a licensed practitioner for a bona fide illness. You shall submit to random drug testing during the period of probation.

18. ABSTENTION FROM ALCOHOL USE

You shall abstain completely from the use of alcoholic beverages.

To whom it may concern,

My name is Teresa McCaffray (former license number 12323), and I am petitioning to have my RVT license reinstated.

Almost 20 years ago, in November of 2004, one call changed my life forever. It was the call that let me know my mother had terminal breast cancer. I was finishing my overnight shift and unfortunately chose to consume alcohol at a restaurant to numb everything, and get away from the devastating news I had just received. I was 25 years old. I then chose to drive intoxicated. That was and has been my only encounter with law enforcement in my life, which I am now 44 years old. I very quickly realized I could have gravely injured or killed someone, or myself with my selfish decision that morning. In a way, that DUI may have saved my life or someone else's.

I paid my monetary fees, fulfilled all of my legal requirements, and restitutions. The Sheriff's department has no record of the offense anymore as it was so very long ago; so when I was honest on my RVT application, I was confused as to why I was being penalized for something that had happened 14 years prior- especially since I had done everything that was asked of me, by the judicial system, and had zero contact with law enforcement since. I have never had any form of a substance abuse problem, and in the last year I have found that I am taking after my mother and becoming very sensitive to opiates (3 surgeries in the last year). Alcohol does not enter the picture at all anymore for health (cancer) and recreational reasons (competitive weightlifter). I have more than demonstrated that I am a dependable, trustworthy, honest, hardworking, loyal worker and a passionate advocate for my patients; and I have a line of veterinarians and co-workers who will vouch for that.

In February of 2022, I was diagnosed with Stage 2 Invasive Ductal Carcinoma. Over the next year I would have a double mastectomy, a bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy/hysterectomy and bilateral breast reconstruction. I endured 7 weeks of radiation, by the grace of God I did not need chemotherapy. I will be on aromatase inhibitors for the next ten years, and always looking over my shoulder, waiting for "it" to return. I am and always have been (since I was 18) my sole provider, no spouse or family support. I worked as much as I could during my treatment. I have close to \$20,000 in medical bills. If I am put back on probation, I will not be able to afford the monthly fees, and testing fees. I suffer from left arm lymphedema post mastectomy, so I only have one arm that can be used for blood draws, catheters and blood pressures. Probation occasionally required blood samples. As my situation will be lifelong, I can not compromise my only remaining usable veins for anything other than things relating to my cancer.

If I were to get my license reinstated I would be so thankful. I am currently in the process of learning ultrasonography with the hopes of becoming proficient enough to capture images and have them read by a boarded radiologist. My current practice is expanding and this could definitely elevate our level of care in a timely manner; not only for the ill, but as a wellness screening tool. I am very excited about this opportunity. I am also doing a few per diem shifts to

help assist in paying off my ever growing medical bills. I am working 7 days a week. Having my RVT will allow me to be more useful as a relief technician, and will allow me more opportunities.

Medicine has been my life since I came out of the womb (my mother was an ER nurse). Veterinary medicine has been a part of my life since high school. Veterinary medicine is my life. I have lived with my decision and repercussions from a poor decision to drink and drive 20 years ago. I have done my penance, I have paid my price. I have demonstrated that I learned from that event, never repeated it, and never got in trouble with the law since.

I thank you for taking the time to read this, for reviewing my application and giving me the opportunity to possibly reinstate my RVT license. Thank you.


