Revocation and Suspension of Registration; Grounds</p> <p>The Board may revoke or suspend the registration of a registered veterinary technician in this state after notice and hearing for any cause provided in this article. The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions for administrative adjudication in Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, and the board shall have all of the powers granted therein. The Board may revoke or suspend a certificate of registration for any of the following reasons:</p> | | | | |

Record of Animal Receiving Veterinary Services A veterinarian subject to the provisions of this chapter shall, as required by regulation of the Board, keep a written record of all animals receiving veterinary services, and provide a summary of that record to the owner of animals receiving veterinary services, when requested. The minimum amount of information which shall be included in written records and summaries shall be established by the board. The minimum duration of time for which a licensed premise shall retain the written record or a complete copy of the written record shall be determined by the board.</p> | | | | Y |

Recordkeeping (a) Every veterinarian performing any act requiring a license pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 11, Division 2, of the code, upon any animal or group of animals in his custody or in the custody of an animal hospital, shall prepare a written record concerning the animal or animals which shall contain the following information in legible form, if available:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) Name, address, and phone number of animal=s owner. (2) Name and identity of the animal. (3) Age, sex and breed of the animal. (4) Dates (beginning and ending) of custody of the animal. (5) A short history of the animal=s condition as it pertains to the animal=s medical status. (6) Diagnosis or condition at the beginning of custody of the animal. | <p>The availability of the veterinarian who is to provide emergency service shall be specified as either Aveterinarian on premises≡ or Aveterinarian on call≡.</p> <p>The phrase Aveterinarian on premises≡ shall mean that there is a veterinarian actually present at the hospital who is prepared to render emergency veterinary services.</p> <p>The phrase Aveterinarian on call≡ shall mean that a veterinarian is not present at the hospital, but is able to respond within a reasonable time to requests for emergency veterinary services and has been designated to so respond.</p> | | | | |
| <p>4830.5. Report of Dog Injured or Killed in Staged Animal Fight; Civil Liability</p> <p>Whenever any license under this chapter has reasonable cause to believe that a dog has been injured or killed through participation in a staged animal fight, as prescribed in Section 597b of the Penal Code, it shall be the duty of such licensee to promptly report the same to the appropriate law enforcement authorities of the county, city, or city and county in which the same occurred. No licensee shall incur any civil liability as a result of making any report pursuant to this section.</p> | | | | Y |
| <p>H&S 111440. Manufacture, sale, etc., of misbranded drug or device</p> <p>It is unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, deliver, hold, or offer for sale any drug or device that is misbranded (outdated drugs are considered misbranded).</p> | | | | Y |
