



I am writing to submit my name for consideration for the open RVT position on the Multi Disciplinary Committee (MDC). As you are aware, the MDC will be taking over the duties of the soon to be dissolved RVTC. As Chair of the RVTC, I will make every effort to wrap up issues that are currently in front of the Committee. However, the future is sure to bring new challenges regarding RVT education, certification and utilization.

Since its inception, the MDC has proven to be an excellent venue for addressing many of the complex issues confronting the veterinary profession. However, up until now, the MDC has not dealt with RVT specific issues. I believe that my experience with the RVTC would serve the MDC well as it takes over responsibility for these duties.



Dear Veterinary Medical Board:

The Board of our Association previously wrote to you recommending the appointment of Dr. Oscar Chavez and Kim Williams, RVT to the Multidisciplinary Committee (MDC). As you are aware, Ms. Williams was subsequently appointed to the Veterinary Medical Board.

We would like to take this opportunity to recommend that you appoint Carol Schumacher, RVT to the RVT opening on MDC for many of the same reasons we supported Ms. Williams. Because the MDC will be taking over the functions of the Registered Veterinary Technician Committee (RVTC), we feel it is critical that the MDC have several members that served on the RVTC. There are many technical issues that have been the responsibility of the RVTC, including RVT school inspection, RVT examination & licensing, RVT eligibility categories and RVT job tasks. Having members on the MDC who previously served on the RVTC would insure that the MDC will be able to handle these duties with a minimum "learning curve".

In addition to her experience on the RVTC, Ms. Schumacher brings her experience as a partner in a small animal general practice and an animal rehabilitation facility. We believe that her combination of experience on the RVTC, as a working RVT and a practice owner, makes her particularly well suited to handle the responsibilities of the MDC.

We look forward to working with the newly constituted MDC as it takes on the duties of the RVTC in the future.


