**INTREPRETER:** Pursuant to section 11435.20 of the Government Code, the hearing shall be conducted in English language. If a party or party's witness does not proficiently speak or understand the English language and before commencement of the hearing requests language

assistance, an agency subject to the language assistance requirement in section 11435.15 of the Government Code shall provide a certified interpreter or an interpreter approved by the administrative law judge conducting the proceedings. The cost of providing the interpreter shall be paid by the agency having jurisdiction over the matter if the administrative law judge or hearing officer so directs, otherwise by the party for whom the interpreter is provided. If you or a witness requires the assistance of an interpreter, ample advance notice of this fact should be given to the Office of Administrative Hearings so that appropriate arrangements can be made.

**CONTINUANCES:** Under section 11524 of the Government Code, the agency may grant a continuance, but when an administrative law judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings has been assigned to the hearing, no continuance may be granted except by him or her or by the presiding judge for good cause. Petition Narrative

To the California Veterinary Medical Board,

I am requesting an early termination of my probation period scheduled from April 9, 2018 to April 9, 2021. I was placed on probation for failing to answer truthfully the question of any past legal charges against my record. I answered no to having any misdemeanor charges when I had a charge from 17 years ago. Under law this is considered fraudulent.

While I uphold the truth in that I did not answer with the intent to commit fraud I also uphold the truth in that I had a responsibility to ensure that I took care of this matter years ago by having it removed from my record. Since I did not complete that responsibility, I had the responsibility to reveal it on my request for licensing without excuse. The Veterinary Medical Board has an obligation to uphold the highest of standards within the Veterinary Profession and therefor disciplinary action was warranted against me. It is not the Boards responsibility to determine the intent behind my actions but to ensure I learn to responsibly and ethically choose my actions.

I have completed all aspects required of me by my probation including Ethics training and have continued to strive to be an ethically sound professional as well as an individual. I have also taken and completed the steps to terminate the misdemeanor from my record. I have worked hard to continue my pursuit of my degree to be able to become an RVT. Attached you will find my exemplary transcript from Purdue University and a certificate of completion for my Ethics course. Also attached are two letters of recommendation from my current employers.

I now ask the Board to consider terminating my probation after completion of two years as I feel that while I failed to correctly and truthfully answer my application I have learned from my mistake and understand the repercussions of my actions. I am very humbled and sincerely sorry for failing to uphold my responsibility of answering truthfully on my application. I can ensure without a doubt it will not happen again.

While this mistake warranted disciplinary action, I also ask the Board to consider me entirely as an individual professional and not let this singular mistake define me. Hask the Board to take into consideration the disciplinary actions I have completed as well as the recommendations of my employers past and present and the fact I have lived and continue to live a respectful law abiding life in and out of the work place.

If the final written quarterly report is not made 14 as directed, the period of probation shall be extended until such time as the final report is received 15 by the Board. 16

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#### 3. **Cooperation with Probation Surveillance**

Respondent shall comply with the Board's probation surveillance program. All costs for 18 probation monitoring shall be borne by Respondent. Probation monitoring costs are set at a rate of 19 \$100 per month for the duration of the probation. Respondent shall notify the Board of any 20change of name or address or address of record within thirty (30) days of the change. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Code sections 480(a)(1) and 10 480(a)(A), in that Respondent was convicted of the following crime that is substantially related 11 to the qualifications, functions or duties required for a veterinary assistant controlled substance 12 permit: 13 On or about June 4, 2003, in the case of *People v. Elisabeth Schultz*, 14 а. . (Super. Ct. Placer County, 2003, Case No. 62-020929), Respondent was convicted on her plea of 15 nolo contendre to violating Penal Code section 273a(a) (child abuse/endangerment), a 16 misdemeanor, and thereafter was sentenced on or about July 16, 2003. As a result of the 17 conviction, Respondent was sentenced to three (3) years probation, sixty (60) days in jail (stayed), 18 ordered to complete 100 hours of charity work, a fifty-two (52) week Parent Class, and Child 19 Abuser's Program, and ordered to pay \$125 in fees and restitution. The facts and circumstances 20 are that on or about March 27, 2001, Respondent's eleven (11) month-old son was scalded with 21 second and third degree burns when he fell into a bathtub of extremely hot water while 22 Respondent was out of the room. 23 SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION 24 (Employment of Fraud in Obtaining A Controlled Substance Permit) 25 Respondent's application is subject to denial under Code sections 4842(c) and 480(d) 8. 26 in that Respondent knowingly made a false statement in her application for licensure. The 27 circumstances are that on or about November 14, 2016, Respondent submitted her application for 28 3

1	a Veterinary Assistant Controlled Substance Permit to the Board, and verified under penalty of		
2	perjury that it was accurate. That application asked if Respondent had ever been convicted of a		
3	crime. Respondent responded "No." This response was false, and Respondent knew it was false,		
4	because Respondent had previously been convicted of a crime as described above in paragraph 7.		
5	PRAYER		
6	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,		
7	and that following the hearing, the Veterinary Medical Board issue a decision:		
8	1. Denying the application of Beth Schultz aka Elisabeth Christman for a Veterinary		
9	Assistant Controlled Substance Permit; and,		
10	2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
