# ICVA 2025 Assessment Grant Program – Now OPEN – April 1, 2025

# Licensing Updates

#### Renewal Postcard

Beginning in June 2025, the Board updated its license renewal notice to be fully encompassed on a postcard. The postcard provides a QR code that can be scanned and takes the licensee directly to BreEZe to login and renew their license. If the licensee requires fingerprint submission as a condition to renew, the postcard provides notification of the requirement. A copy of the renewal postcard is attached for reference.

#### **Board Applications Received**

The Board received a total of 4,257 license applications across all license types in Fiscal Year (FY) 24/25. Compared to those received in FY 23/24, there was a decrease of approximately 400 applications received.

The most significant decline was 300 less applications received for veterinary assistant controlled substance permit (VACSP). Although the total number of applications received decreased, the Board received almost 100 more applications for veterinarians in FY 24/25 compared to FY 23/24.

Overall, the number of applications received through Q4 24/25 decreased by approximately comparing to Q4 of FY 23/24.

#### Licenses, Registrations, and Permits Issued

The Board issued 3,759 licenses, registrations, and permits in FY 24/25. That equates to a slight decrease compared to the number issued in FY 23/24, which was 3,884.

Despite a decline of licenses, registrations, and permits issued overall, the Board issued more veterinarian licenses in FY 24/25 (906) than it has in the prior three FYs. Similar to applications received, the most significant decline in licenses, registrations, and permits issued was seen by VACSPs, with approximately 150 less issued.

#### Applications Pending

The Board's pending applications at the conclusion of FY 24/25 across all license types was 584. That represents at decrease in pending applications by approximately 35% comparing to the number of pending applications at the end of FY 23/24, which was 888.

# License Population

Concluding data analysis from FY 24/25, the Board's total license population increased to 48,055 at the conclusion of the FY. Compared to 46,325 at the conclusion of FY 23/24, the Board's licensee population increased by approximately 2,000 licensees.
